NCURA Officers Responsibilities



Christa Johnson Colorado State University **Nominating and Leadership Development Committee**

Christa Johnson was appointed to serve a two year term on the Nominating and Leadership Development Committee. The NLDC committee is charged with identifying, training, promoting and rewarding future and current leaders of the organization, including NCURA's national officers and award recipients. Each region nominates two people and the national organization selects one to serve. The Committee members themselves generally have been long-time members of NCURA with a broad network of colleagues across the country.



Region VII has amended the Bylaws to accomplish important procedural changes.

The first change was to the election process that allows for the election to proceed with at least one candidate willing to run for any given position. Previously, we were required to have at least two candidates running for any open position.

Secondly, the Regional Executive Committee amended the Bylaws to separate the current Secretary-Treasurer into two positions, with separate duties and term limits.

Third, the duties of the Immediate Past Chair are now added to the Bylaws.

Finally, the Ad Hoc Committee descriptions were moved to the Region VII Administrative Policies document.

How the Shutdown is Impacting Research

The Antideficiency Act prohibits agencies from incurring obligations beyond their current appropriation. Therefore, Federal agencies that are not covered by appropriation bills signed into law are most heavily impacted by a partial government shutdown. Below is a list of agencies currently affected:

- Department of Commerce
- Department of the Interior
- Department of Justice
- Department of State
- Department of Transportation
- Department of Treasury
- Environmental Protection Agency (EPA)
- Homeland Security (DHS)
- National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA)
- National Endowment for the Arts (NEA)
- National Endowment for the Humanities (NSF)
- National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA)
- National Science Foundation (NSF)
- United States Department of Agriculture (USDA)

What does this mean for you?

Unless your PI has received a stop work order notice, the current agreements and awards are not affected by the shutdown. Progress reports and any financial reports should be submitted business as usual. However, no payments or cash draws will be processed until the government reopens.

No new funding will be issued during the shutdown. Proposals can still be submitted, but will not be reviewed. Please check your federal agency's website to ensure nothing has changed for your specific program. Most agency websites are functional, however agency representatives will not be able to answer programmatic questions via phone or e-mail during the shutdown.




Ask the Jackalope
